


# PINK

As part of their IPC outdoor learning, our Year 6 learners went for a trip to South Coast. They visited Sheldrick Falls which is one of the many magnificent attractions within Shimba Hills National Park. While hiking to the waterfall, they learnt about the medicinal use of the various plants and trees that perfectly provided shed for them during the hike. They also spotted animals such as, antelope and warthogs on their way.

On the next day, the learners visited Bora Bora Wildlife Park where they spotted wild and domestic animals such as, pigs, guinea fowls, peacocks, crocodiles, giraffes, baboons, zebras and antelopes.



During the trip the learners were able to identify some of the content they have learnt in class such as, adaptation features of animals and the symbiotic relationship between organisms in Science. Their teachers were also able to explain other features of animals and plants they are yet to learn.









#### Year 10 Trip to South Coast

OAM encourages students to participate in educational trips in order to experience first-hand the history, artwork, and cultures they have studied. Our Year 10 students visited South Coast - Diani to learn about river measurements, Kongo mosque historical site, swash, backwash, and longshore drift.

They also visited KALRO –Kenya Agricultural Livestock Research Organization weather station and enjoyed an informative discussion about a variety of weather instruments and measurements on site led by the officials.

Later that day, they learned about coastal crop propagation including cassava, maize and fruit propagation at KALRO plant propagation.

#### Year 10 Humanities Trip to the Rift Valley

Our Year 10 learners visited Rift Valley - Nakuru to complement their studies in Geography and History.

#### Day 1, 2 and 3:

The learners set off on a trip to Nakuru to visit Olkaria power plant and later, Elementaita Gorge (Hells Gate) where they learnt about the processes leading to the formation of a gorge.

They later visited Mogotio Equator point where they were taught about the equator using a model of the earth and the forces around the north and south poles and the effects before proceeding to Lord Egerton's Castle, Menengai Crater and to the Maumau caves inside the Menengai forest.

#### Day 4:

They departed for Kariandusi
Historic Site where they learnt
about different Stone Age tools
used by the Homo erectus who is
believed to have been present in
the region due to the presence of
rivers. Thereafter, they went to
Thomson Falls in Nyandarua where
the students had the opportunity
to see the source of the water fall.













#### Day 5:

The learners set out for a game drive at Lake Nakuru National Park where they saw many game animals including the rare white rhinos. Later, they proceeded to Makalia Waterfalls inside the park before heading to Nakuru town. On day 6, the learners travelled back to Mombasa with lots of learning experiences to share with their peers. They had an educative trip which they recapped in class to complement their respective lessons.











#### Year 11 South Coast Trip to Timboni Nature Trail and Central Business District'

Our Year 11 learners visited Timboni Nature trail to learn about dereliction and industrial activities such as, cement processing and land recovery in the nature trails.

They also visited the CBD to learn about urban zoning and how land is used in the Central Business District.


