












Our Reception class children presented "The Beauty and the Beast" on Saturday, 25th March 2023, at the Junior High Auditori-



Kindergarten Assemblies

These skills benefit mathematical thinking because they help them to understand numbers and shapes which can improve their understanding of concepts behind math procedures.

The classes help the learners to develop physical, creative, emotional and social skills while having lots of fun.



How to Make

Tomato & Cheese Toasted Sandwich

Our Year One learners are currently learning about listening to instructions. They are covering how-to /instruction learning models. In this lesson they were introduced to recipes.

They made simple sandwiches using different ingredients and identified the different stages such as, putting the tomatoes and vegetables in the slices of bread, adding cheese and later, toasting the bread.

The learners read out the steps of the recipe, asked questions and were later served the sandwiches for brunch.

















Year 2 Exit Point 'Treasure Island'

The International Primary Curriculum (IPC) offers a thematic unit of study on Treasure Island. In History, the learners explored the lives of pirates and the characteristics of different types of ships In Geography, they examined the physical features of islands and oceans.

In Science, the learners investigated the natural environment of a tropical island and sea life In Literacy, they read different stories during class, they also developed their writing skills through journaling and storytelling.

To complement this unit, learners carried out a pirate research project while exploring the hunt for treasure.

They later made treasure hunt cases using boxes and containers, paint, markers, stickers, glitter, jewels, gold coins, candy and much more.

'HOW HUMANS WORK'

The International Primary Curriculum (IPC) entry point 'How Humans Work' explores the human body and how it works.

The unit covers a wide range subtopics such as, nutrition, exercise, hygiene, health, and disease. Learners were able to study systems of the body, such as the respiratory, circulatory, and digestive systems.

They also learnt about the importance of a balanced diet and regular exercise, as well as how to prevent and treat illnesses and diseases.

During this unit, they also conducted research, made observations, and participated in practical activities to deepen their understanding of the human body and its functions. To complement the unit, they were required to demonstrate the different elements of the human body using different materials on a manila paper.











Learning about Shapes in Maths

Learning about shapes and understanding the different elements is a good foundation for understanding math formulas.

To illustrate the different aspects the learners made models of different shapes and presented them in class.



Inventions That Changed the World

Historical inventions teach students about key inventions and inventors from different time periods. The learners learnt about the invention of the light bulb, telephone and computer. They also discussed the impact of these inventions on society and how they have helped shape the modern world.

During the lesson, Ms. Diana urged the learners to reflect about the challenges they face in their everyday lives and the possible solutions to at least one of the challenges. They were also free to design and describe their invention, create a prototype, or even build a working model.







Junior School Assemblies

This term our learners have been focusing on learning about the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which are the 17 global goals that were adopted by the United Nations in 2015 with the aim of ending poverty, protecting the planet, and promoting peace and prosperity for all by the year 2030.

These goals are very important to junior school students and all students in 2023 for several reasons, including:

- The SDGs help to raise awareness among learners about important global issues such as poverty, hunger, gender inequality, climate change, and environmental degradation and encourage them to take more responsibility for their role in achieving the goals.
- The SDGs also inspire learners to take action by participating in activities aimed at achieving the goals. For instance, our students have participated in tree planting and recycling activities to help achieve SDG 13 (Climate Action). This encourages an early sense of personal responsibility that can help learners grow into adults who prioritize social and environmental sustainability.
- Learners develop critical thinking skills that help them analyze complex problems and think creatively about potential solutions. This helps in preparing them for future leadership roles in fields such as politics, economics, and social development. Our Year Five learners have complemented this through units such as, 'Champions for Change' where they displayed the process of voting and learnt more about politics from Hon. Flora Chebule -Deputy Governor Kilifi County through her visit to the OAM campus during their Entry Point.
- The SDGs also offers various opportunities for students to learn about global issues such as poverty, climate change and inequality. These issues are critical to the well-being of people and the planet, so it is essential for students to understand and take action to resolve them.

The SDGs play a significant role in shaping the future of our school, and therefore it is vital for the OAM community to take action towards creating a sustainable future.







Educational School Trips for Students

The opportunity to learn outside of the classroom, gain real-life experience and apply practical knowledge.

When learners participate in hands-on activities, interact with professionals, visit places of interest, and attend workshops, they are likely to understand complex concepts and develop a deeper connection with their studies.

Similarly, when they interact with people from other regions or countries and learn about their customs, languages and lifestyles, they tend to develop empathy, respect, acceptance and appreciation for their individual differences making them better peers to their classmates.

School trips encourage students to build their social skills, communication and teamwork abilities and overcome their fears - students interact with their peers, teachers and staff outside the classroom, collaborate on tasks, and share their knowledge, thus developing relationships and cooperativeness.

They also develop leadership skills that help them to become effective leaders both in school and in their personal lives while encouraging them to become self-reliant and resourceful.

'Shetani' means 'devil' in Kiswahili: the flows were formed three hundred years ago and local people believed that it was the devil himself emerging from the earth.

Our learners were taken through the process of the solidification and formation of rocks which is part of the IPC curriculum.

Year 6 Trip to Hell's Kitchen **Marafa**

Having learnt about the unit 'Material Changes' where different elements change form, rocks and soil, the Year 6 learners had an excursion to Hell's Kitchen Marafa.

The aim of the trip was to expose learners to explore the process of rock formation and observe the effects of rock/soil erosion.

The learners were accompanied by Ms. Mercy Ezara, Mr. Wycliff, Ms. Martha, Mr. Sam, and Mr. Kelvin. During the trip learners were able to witness the different colours decorating the hips of soil inform of hills.

They learnt about the beauty of the Hell's Kitchen, Marafa, a mini 'grand canyon' depression of sandstone, comprising dramatic layers of calcium, sulphur and iron.

These platforms, complemented by the assemblies are both used to celebrate the achievements of learners. They give them a sense of accomplishment and recognition, which is critical to their personal and academic growth towards the better good of the school community.



Junior School Inter- House Debate

"Schools should replace books with laptops"

Our Junior School learners have held informative debates every Wednesday during house meets to discuss various topics such as, the use of technology in class over books and vice versa. The four houses each presented their argument in a number of rounds while the judges analyzed the quality of research, presentation skills and logic each team displayed.

The proposers argued that using laptops purely in class can be a distraction for students as they can easily access social media and other non-educational websites and that it can lead to a decrease in focus and productivity during discussions. Additionally, they made it clear that laptops are more expensive and not all students have access to them, leading to a potential class imbalance.

Furthermore, they also pointed out that the use of laptops in the classroom can create a dependency on technology, which can be detrimental if technology fails. In another scenario, they illustrated how the use of laptops fully in class might encourage plagiarism. During their argument, they also illustrated the important role

books play in providing a more focused and distraction-free environment for learning and that, books are more cost-effective than purchasing and maintaining laptops.

Opposers, on the other hand, argued that laptops are a powerful tool for learning in the classroom "With a laptop, students can take notes quickly and efficiently, organize information in a digital format, and have easy access to online resources and research. Additionally, laptops can be used for collaborative projects and group assignments, allowing students to work together in real time.

They also added that laptops aid in interactive learning through the use of multimedia tools such as videos, images, and simulations which make the learning process more engaging and effective. Similarly, the use of digital notes and files on laptops help to reduce the clutter of books and paper notes, enabling students to access their notes and materials more efficiently.

During both arguments it was clear that it is beneficial to incorporate a balance of both books and laptops in the classroom to cater to different learning styles.







Artificial Intelligence (AI) has become a major player in the technology industry, transforming various sectors. One area that has been significantly affected is education. AI has the potential to enhance the education system by changing the way students learn and how educational institutions operate. However, the use of AI in the classroom has ignited a debate on whether it is beneficial or detrimental to students' education.

Our Senior School learners from the four different houses present-ed their motion regarding the role of Al in class. The Proposers expressed a lot of hope in the new system citing some projected positive outcomes in the system. They explained that the AI-pow-ered software can be used to analyze student's learning patterns and behavior, which can help teachers to customize their teach-ing approach to suit individual needs. They also explained that this would help students who struggle in certain areas, as they can receive tailored learning experiences that address their specific needs.

During the second round, the team illustrated how the Al-powered software can help identify patterns in student's performance, this, they explained, can help teachers to intervene and provide the necessary support thus improving student's performance because of offering immediate feedback.

"The education system has grown over the years, and teachers are expected to handle more tasks than they did in the past. Al-powered software can help ease the workload by automating tasks such as grading, giving feedback, and marking attendance. This would give teachers more time to focus on teaching and providing support to students who need extra help," one of the team members said.

However, the opposers expressed their reservations on Al. One of the major concerns they addressed was its potential eliminate teachers' jobs - Al-powered software can automate various tasks, and it can lead to teachers losing their jobs as these tasks get outsourced.

Apart from that, the team explored instances where the system could potentially breach privacy and security - Al-powered software collects data on learners' behavior, which can result in their data being exposed.

Inappropriate use of data collected by AI software can lead to unintended consequences such as compromising the student's privacy, important information being leaked, and data breaches.

In conclusion, AI has the potential to revolutionize the education sector by producing personalized learning experiences, improving students' performance, and easing the workload of the teachers. However, AI has also sparked controversy, with concerns about job loss and privacy and security.

Therefore, it is crucial to address these concerns and find a balance between AI and human involvement in the education sector to ensure that the students' learning experiences are optimal.

Entry Point Risk

The International Middle Years Curriculum (IMYC) entry point for risk helps students learn to take appropriate risks and become more resilient individuals. It encourages students to take calculated risks in a safe and controlled environment, allowing them to push their boundaries and develop their confidence as thinkers and learners.

Learners also explore and gain an understanding of risk-taking and how it can have both positive and negative outcomes. They learn to assess potential risks, make informed decisions, and develop problem-solving skills in response to challenges they may encounter.

To complement this unit, our learners took part in various group activities that challenged their physical, emotional, and cognitive abilities - outdoor. They were required to race using manila papers as shields / propellers. The race was timed by the team leaders and every participant had a tally of scores illustrating how each performed in the various races.
