
Even though it is a holiday, the younger generation needs to grasp the significance of the day and the battle our independence warriors had to win.

The International Early Years Curriculum (IEYC) is a child-centered and research informed curriculum. The IEYC recognizes best practice and the developmental needs of early years education including advocating for learners' overall well-being.

To complement the unit, Dr. Adil Gulam (a dental surgeon) taught the learners how to take care of teeth. They discussed about healthy and unhealthy foods and how they can affect their dental health.











Reception Class Entry Point 'Chattering Children'

The Entry Point 'Chattering Children' emphasizes on the significance of expression in fostering growth of learners.

The unit aims to cultivate excellent language acquisition and communication skills that promote the creation of relationships and the development of a variety of skills.

'How Humans Work'

The International Primary Curriculum (IPC) entry point 'How Humans Work' explores the human body and how it works.

The unit covers a wide range of subtopics such as, nutrition, exercise, hygiene, health, and disease. Learners were able to study systems of the body, such as the respiratory, circulatory, and digestive systems.

They also learnt about the importance of a balanced diet and regular exercise, as well as how to prevent and treat illnesses and diseases.

During this unit, they also conducted research, made observations, and participated in practical



activities to deepen their understanding of the human body and its functions.

To complement the unit, they were required to demonstrate the different elements of the human body using different materials on a manila paper.



YEAR 1 EXIT POINT 'TREASURE ISLAND'

IPC Treasure Island is an International Primary Curriculum (IPC) unit that focuses on a learning adventure that combines creativity and teamwork.

During this unit, our Year One learners explored an exciting journey to discover hidden treasures and overcome challenges through various interactive activities and tasks. By working together in teams, they learnt the importance of cooperation, leadership and effective communication.

They also developed resilience and perseverance as they overcame different challenges. For their exit point, they made pirate hats and swords using recycled materials.













Year 3 Science Display 'How Humans Work'

In this unit, learners began investigating the answers to various questions regarding the human body much like actual doctors or scientists would.

They later collected and presented various findings describing their observations in written prose. To complement the unit, the learners held an exhibition.

During the display they explained:

- The different functions of teeth.
- •The digestive system.
- The Circulatory System.
- The Respiratory System.
- The skeleton and muscles.

Year 6 Entry Point 'What Price Progress'

Our Year 6 learners have spent time researching famous inventors and inventions from across centuries. They later created their own inventions.









House Meets Shoe Box Challenge

OAM Inter-House Shoe Box Challenge was held across the Junior School section. The learners rose to the challenge when asked to mobilize their shoes to fill the four shoe boxes presented.

In the first event, the teachers participated in a 3-minute challenge displaying their competitive spirit in gathering and wearing the right pair of shoes. The four different houses – Topaz, Ruby, Sapphire and Emerald later joined in contesting for the Shoe Box Challenge winner title.

This activity was a unique opportunity for learners to engage in a challenging competition that explored a variety of skills such as, problem solving, metacognition, collaboration, communication and much more.









Entry Point 'Risk'

The International Middle Years Curriculum (IMYC) entry point for risk helps students learn to take appropriate risks and become more resilient individuals. It encourages students to take calculated risks in a safe and controlled environment, allowing them to push their boundaries and develop their confidence as thinkers and learners.

Learners also explore and gain an understanding of risk-taking and how it can have both positive and negative outcomes. They learn to assess potential risks, make informed decisions, and develop problem-solving skills in response to challenges they may encounter. To complement this unit, our learners took part in various group activities that challenged their physical, emotional, and cognitive abilities – outdoor. They were required to race using manila papers as shields / propellers.

The race was timed by the team leaders and every participant had a tally of scores illustrating how each performed in the various races.

Swahili Day

Swahili is considered one of the top most spoken languages in the world, and in Africa, it is the most widely used native language. The language, which enjoys national status in Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda, is also widely spoken in parts of the Democratic Republic of Congo, Rwanda and Burundi.

In 2021 UNESCO declared the 7th of July as world Swahili Day. The school prioritizes to celebrate Kiswahili language and culture of the Swahili people within every academic year.

To commemorate the day, our learners came to school in Swahili attire, from lessos, to kanzus, buibui's, dera's and vikoi's.













Project Based Learning (PBL)

Empowering learners to succeed in a future that is becoming increasingly dynamic

With PBL our Teaching and Learning Department has reported strong improvements in collaborative learning, which, in turn, has empowered students to be more engaged in sharing knowledge.

Additionally, teachers have been able to asses student progress in different subjects easily. Our learners continue to engage in research, analysis and problem-solving, which ultimately culminates in presentations.

During this time, the students work closely with their teachers and peers to develop solutions to problems and create models that demonstrate their knowledge. All projects are subject to deadlines and are part of the grading, therefore, learners put forth effort and focus on the task at hand. As a result, they become more invested in the outcome of the project and less likely to procrastinate.

Drugs Awareness Week

Drugs Awareness Week is an alcohol, tobacco and other drug and violence prevention awareness campaign that aims to educate learners and encourage our school community to follow the same guidelines safe from substance abuse.

During this week, our learners focused on positive and mindful messages through a variety of themed activities. On the last day of the week, the students wore red to symbolize their commitment to a drug-free community.













Year 9 Curriculum Evening

Year 9 Curriculum Evening provides a platform that offers an overview and highlights the nature of the Cambridge International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) curriculum in Year 10.

During this event, the Assistant Head Teaching and Learning, Ms. Mildred and other IGCSE subject teachers welcomed specific questions about the curriculum.

The event was complemented by the presence of the higher education learning agency, UNISERV. The team supports and creates awareness about university and college placement abroad.





School excursions are a perfect way to complement the learning that takes place in class. Students are able to explore their culture and that of other communities, Kenya's wildlife and learn the country's geography while gathering key 21st century skills.

During this trip, our Year 9 learners visited Lake Nakuru National Park, Menengai Crater, Thompson Falls Nyahururu, Lord Egerton Castle, Kengen Olkaria power plant, Kariandusi historical site among many others sites in the Rift Valley. The objectives of the trip was to learn about:

- Population settlement, density and distribution.
- Geothermal Power generation and distribution.
- Wildlife conservation and tourism.
- Origin of man and his evolution.
- Agriculture and colonial history in Kenya.
- Rivers, river processes and features.
- Coriolis Effect on the equator.
- Volcanism and formation of the rift valley.

The Great Rift Valley stretches across East Africa extending from Tanzania through Kenya and into Ethiopia, from south to north. Most of the Great Rift Valley falls in Kenya's Rift Valley Province and is said to be the most beautiful section.

The rift offers some of the most breath-taking natural scenery in a diverse mix of dramatic escarpments, mountain highlands, indigenous forest, gorges, beautiful lakes and savannahs.

These valleys, cliffs and lakes have played a key role in bringing together different species in a variety of environments, which spurred on archaeologists' discoveries of many ancient fossils, gaining fascinating insights into the progression of human evolution.

Lake Nakuru National Park surrounds Lake Nakuru, a famous soda lake that is found on the floor of Kenya's Rift Valley. Lake Nakuru National Park was the first destination in Kenya to establish a rhino sanctuary and is

currently home to the largest number of black rhinos in the country.

Another rare and endangered species is the Rothchild's giraffe that was introduced into the park in the 1970s.

The birdlife is another major site for visitors, with over 400 species that populate its skies including pelicans, cormorants and flamingos.

The learners also visited The Olkaria II Geothermal Power Station also known as Olkaria II Geothermal Power Plant. The









facility is located in the Hell's Gate National Park in Olkaria, Nakuru County, at the eastern end of the Eastern Rift Valley, about 43 km southwest of the nearest town, Naivasha, and about 122 km northwest of Nairobi, Kenya's capital. The learners were able to learn more from the experts and facilitators at the site.

This and many other experiences highlighted the memorable experiences the learners had gathered and much was done in class to recap on the learning outcomes.

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
