

The Entry Point is a celebration that introduces the Unit of Work.



Therefore, we would like to congratulate our very own two students who won a partial scholarship to attend the Immerse Summer School classes at Oxford University during the holiday.



The two students are Jeremy Kombe and Najma Feisal. We encourage more students to register and participate in the 2024 Immerse Education Essay Competition which is now open.



On 11th September, 2023, BTEC Enterprise and Entrepreneurship visited Brown's Cheese Factory in Limuru where they focused on learning about the business start-up, marketing, business decision making, financing a business, creating a product for sale and raw materials used for the development of a product for a business start-up.

The student's experience was very nice because they were able to acquire knowledge from the trip including how to plan and organise the company, how to get resources for a cheese business at affordable cost and they were able to understand about cheese competitors in the market.

During the visit at brown's Cheese Factory, students were taken through the ingredients for cheese making and process of storing pizza before dispatching to the market for sale.

BTEC HOSPITALITY BROWNS' FARM VISIT

On 18th September 2023, year 12 and year 13 BTEC Hospitality students visited Browns Cheese Farm in Tigoni. At the farm, they got a first-hand experience in the making of cottage cheese, along with a lecture on the origins and development of cheese making.

After the cheese tour, the students walked through the organic farm. The farm has a large variety of both local and indigenous plants that coexist in a chemical free environment.

In this set up, the students got to witness organic farming and understand that it is a viable idea that can transform the quality of food used in the hospitality industry.

Snack time allows teachers to monitor social behavior and observe different table manners displayed by learners. Apart from it being a routine, it presents a good opportunity for the teacher to bond with the learner while learning in a different setting.

Our Playgroup teachers take advantage of this opportunity to empower learners to identify a variety of foods, their colours and pronunciation.

As easy as it looks, it also helps set standards for independence and development of fine motor skills by encouraging learners to feed by themselves.

Through touch, smell, taste and texture of different foods learners are also able to involve their sensory experiences thus enhancing cognitive development.

Let's Tidy Up!

At the age of two to three years, our Playgroup learners are still developing their cognitive and motor skills, so patience and repetition is key. They are introduced to organizing items within their environment while gradually introducing basic organizational concepts.

These concepts develop into independence and serve as a foundation for more advanced skills in the future hence, they become more responsible, efficient and better equipped to manage their tasks and belongings.

In this lesson, learners were encouraged to tidy up as they prepared for 'mommy time'.



Who won the challenge?

During their Math lesson, learners were able to balance a ball while walking on a long rope.

The mission was to keep the ball balanced on their head, steady enough to walk through the entire race while reciting the number of steps they made. This activity helps learners to elevate their mastery skills

The skills gathered here are also fundamental for various physical activities, from walking and

running to more complex sports and activities like riding a bicycle which are a key component of fine and gross motor skills.

They help learners refine their control over their body movements, enabling them to perform tasks like writing, colouring, drawing, painting, tying shoelaces and other activities.

It also helps them to improve their ability to maintain their attention span in class.

It's essential to make learning sounds a positive and engaging experience, catering to individual needs and abilities.

Additionally, consistency and repetition are key to reinforcing sound recognition skills in kindergarteners.

Kindergarten Assemblies

Every Friday morning our Kindergarten learners participate in different themed assemblies.

They explore different units they have been learning in class complemented by props to tell stories that convey important lessons and values by performing short skits, reciting poems and sharing their work during the assembly.

Year 2 Entry Point 'from A to B' Trip to the train station - **Standard Gauge Railway (SGR)**

The IPC Entry Point, 'from A to B' trip to the train station was an exciting and educational experience for learners. They learnt how to coordinate transportation through a guided exploration.

They also learnt a lot at the ticket counters, waiting areas and the arrival/departure board including the process of buying tickets and boarding.

Later, they had the opportunity of observing an illustration of how ticket vending machines work. They role-played buying tickets and interviewed the personnel about their various roles at the station.

After the trip, they had a debriefing session where students shared their observations, experiences and questions.







lum (IPC) unit 'Vanishing Rain forests' is a thematic study designed to help students to explore and understand the importance of rainforests, the challenges they face, and the need for conservation.

The Year 4 learners set up a rainforest-themed sensory experience in the hall, complete with sounds, plants, and images. They learnt about where rainforests are located and their characteristics. They also explored conservation efforts through initiatives and the organizations working to protect rainforests.

This unit not only educates students about the importance of preserving these critical ecosystems but also empowers them to be environmentally conscious and take action to protect the planet. It fosters interdisciplinary learning, critical thinking and an appreciation for mother nature.





Year 6 Entry Point 'Growing Up'

The IPC Entry Point, 'Growing Up' is designed to introduce learners to the concept of personal growth and development. This entry point typically serves as the beginning of a thematic unit that explores various aspects of growing up, including physical, emotional, and social growth.

It encourages them to explore their own experiences and feelings related to growing up while also fostering a sense of curiosity and empathy towards others. During this unit, learners were encouraged to think about how they have changed since they were younger by reflecting on their own experiences of growing up. To explain the growth, they created self-portraits, growth charts and collages using their old pictures.

In Science, they discussed topics such as, the human body, nutrition, and the importance of exercise for physical growth. After the entry point, they reflected on what they've learned and how they can apply their knowledge and insights to their ongoing studies.

Building with LEGO bricks fosters creativity and encourages students to think critically and solve problems. Learners also get a chance to display their collaborative skills which require teamwork and collaboration.

OAM LEGO-based STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, The Arts and Mathematics) activities are integrated across different subjects, promoting interdisciplinary learning such as, exploring concepts in math, ICT, physics, geometry, statistics and more.

The projects simulate real-world scenarios, allowing students to apply what they've learned to practical situations. For example, Kindergarten and Junior School learners build models of houses, airports, malls and much more using lego bricks to complement the units they are covering.

LEGO also offers sets like LEGO Mindstorms that involve coding and robotics.





As the classes progress, learners are required to programme their creations which introduces them to programming concepts and automation. Further to this, they have an opportunity to participate in competitions such as the LEGO League.

Exposure to STEAM concepts through LEGO has inspired our learners to pursue STEAM-related careers.











During their library lessons, they participated in library-themed activities such as, scavenger hunts, book reviews and book-themed quizzes while utilizing the use of the school library as a valuable resource for literacy. To appreciate the art of reading, the Music students performed various pieces while students interacted with different literacy activities within the day.
