#### Inclusive Education Department: Physiotherapy Skills

Physiotherapy plays a major role in people with neurological disorders. Children who are born with disorders such as Cerebral Palsy, Down Syndrome, Autism, ADHD and other disorders need Physiotherapy.

Physiotherapy treatment helps the learners to maximise their potential and promote physical development to reach specific goals such as crawling or walking. The treatment commonly uses exercises with hands-on technics treatment to facilitate their development.

Lack of physiotherapy following a neurological injury, learners may lose many functions, they may be unable to perform certain activities, may lose their independence or even obtain disabilities that may have been corrected. Our school caters the best Physiotherapy sessions to our learners with such needs.

There were different activities like the merry-go-round, bouncing castle, boat riding, etc. Even though the learners were exhausted but were reluctant to leave because they were enjoying it so much






#### Inline Skating Competition


#### SUNBAY SPORTS SWIMMING GALA

It provides financial support that secures treatment for patients. At the end of the day, the school was able to raise 69,775 KES which was given to Lady Hope Wellness Institute.


#### CUSTOMER SERVICE DAY





### OAM Interact Club

The Interact is Rotary International's service club for young learners between the ages of 12 to 18years sponsored by individual Rotary clubs, which ran by students with the support of advisors/teachers. The club's main goal is to provide servant leadership through networks that yield partnership to serve communities that need empowerment.

Over the past years the club has continued its mandate of changing lives through initiatives such as, gifting children from the Cannan Orphanage to attend Ziwa la Ng'ombe Primary School under a full-scholarship, planting trees and cleaning different environments, they have also gifted the Kenya Society for the Protection and Care of Animals, K.S.P.C.A – animal orphanage Mombasa, to cater for the normal operations of the facility.

In 2018, the club in conjunction with Rotary Club of Mombasa, became the first ever Interact club to launch a solar powered borehole at St. Andrews school in Malindi supporting over 10,000 people living in the environs with safe water for consumption.

In 2021, The Interact Club of OAM and The Rotary Club Mombasa donated sanitary towels towards the 'Pad a Girl' Campaign. The initiative was aimed at delivering sanitary pads and health education to girls to make sure that their basic needs do not get in the way of their right to Education.

In 2022, the club collaborated with the Rotary club to make a difference at the St. Charles Lwanga School. This project was an extension of the long-term initiative, Pad-a-Girl project that the club has been dedicated to supporting. They donated food supplies and more items to the approximately 1,000 students at St. Charles Lwanga.

In the same year, the club in partnership with the Kilifi County led by the Deputy Governor, Hon. Flora Chibule donated food items that catered to 200 people for a period of three days during their KCPE exams.



This year, the club has participated in various advocacy programs that aim to conserve the environment such as, planting mangrove trees. They also gifted children at the Muslim Girls Orphanage with food supplies.

To commemorate world sight day, the team attended a workshop organized by Alliance Francaise and facilitated by Ms. Charity who works with the visually abled differently students at the Salvation Army Likoni Primary School. They also supported the Kenya Association of Opticians to raise awareness about eye health and road safety through an eye screening campaign dubbed 'Dereva Hodari' which offered free eye clinic check up to at least 1,500 PSV drivers.

In October this year, they were invited to do a presentation of their past and ongoing projects at the Rotary Club offices in Mombasa. This month, November, the club in conjunction with the OAM Presidential Award team rolled out their first bake sale of 2023 dubbed 'Halloween Bake Sale' featuring different treats and competitions to raise money in order to facilitate their mandate of servant leadership.

### OAM Students bring home the Craydel Championship Cup and an Undergraduate Scholarship Fund after Topping Over 300 Participants during the Craydel Cup Inter-school Business Pitch Competition Held in Nairobi

The Craydel Cup Inter school Business Competition 2023 is platform in partnership with Griffith College Ireland. The program aims to encourage students from all over the country to work in teams to pitch business ideas that offer solutions to critical problems in Africa in the space of commerce, education, healthcare and much more.

The first round of the competition, required the participants to submit their 3-minute video pitch, and a short write up. The judging panel evaluated all the submitted pitches and announced the top 50 teams. The teams were then nominated for a public choice award through a virtual public voting process, and the top 5 qualifiers announced for the 2nd round.

During the second round, participants presented their 2-minute business pitch and demos in front of a panel of judges and after a series of questions, they were rated and the top 3 teams were announced on national television -KTN.

Some of the characteristics key to the judges were:

• How clear the problem or opportunity identified was presented

• How well the solution described, solved the identified problem

How well the target customer was segmented and defined
How clear the revenue model was explained

• How scalable the business idea was

• If the business model was sustainable among many other key priorities to consider when setting up a business.

OAM Team Two (2), NutriHealth Catering "Food is the best medicine", was able to defend and articulately present their model to the judges with the aim of offering the best solution to affordable and well segmented market for nutritious meals to hospitals in Kenya.
