


Diwali Art Competition and celebration





In addition to the new categories three other categories were also undertaken i.e. Rangoli, Heena, and Aarti Thali.



ECO CLUB TREE PLANTING AT KEREITA FOREST

On Saturday 11th Nov 2023, Eco-Club members planted 535 trees in Kereita Forest in order to reforest a destroyed section of the forest. Kereita Forest is in Lari District in Kiambu County and the forest forms part of the Aberdare Forest Reserve.

The highest percentage of this forest is natural indigenous forest and a small section of exotic tree plantation for timber production. In the recent past, a lack of livelihood alterna-tives and a high demand for forest products meant that illegal exploitation of the forest has thrived.

Indige-nous trees are slowly getting depleted due to encroachment to natural forests due to increased population growth and land use change. Eco club took initiative in rehabilitating kereita forest.

During the event, students were educated on the process of planting these trees by Kijabe Environment Volunteers (KENVO).

The process involved removing the seedling from a plastic bag which would be re-cycled, followed by carefully positioning it and stabilizing it with soil.

Each student on average planted around 19 seedlings of different indigenous species such as the olive tree, silk oak, parasol tree, pine tree, croton megalo carpus and bamboo.

This unit gives learners a chance to learn about politics and their government. They learned about:

To raise funds for the initiative, we hosted a non-uniform day which materialized to over Ksh. 50,000. The funds collected facilitated the enrolment of the students for their
