UNIT OF WORK ENTRY POINT

Following the drill, one of our teachers led a discussion with the students about fire safety rules. They emphasized the importance of staying calm in case of a fire,

following the evacuation plan, and never attempting to fight a fire on their own. The students were also reminded of key points in case of fire.


OAM Celebrates its students' success in National Games and Kenya Red Cross Participants




