



Behaviour modification in early intervention offers a multitude of benefits by addressing challenging behaviours proactively and fostering positive developmental trajectories. By utilizing principles like positive reinforcement, it helps learners develop crucial self-regulation and self-discipline skills, enabling them to make better choices and manage their emotions effectively. This approach also significantly improves social and emotional development, as children learn to interact positively with peers and adults, build healthier relationships, and express their needs appropriately. Furthermore, early behaviour modification can lead to enhanced academic performance by improving focus and participation in learning activities, while also reducing stress and anxiety for both children and their families. By intervening early, minor issues are prevented from escalating into more severe problems, laying a strong foundation for long-term success, increased self-esteem, and a better overall quality of life.


## Hitting the Right Notes at the Kenya Music Festival

These initiatives underscore the College's commitment to professional development and a culture of excellence.


With regard to extracurricular activities, the College continued to organize a series of events, which include sports competitions, open days, trainings, mentorship talks, and industry visits to different companies.




## Staff Training on Customer Experience


