congratulate all participants for their outstanding effort in making the exhibition a resounding success.

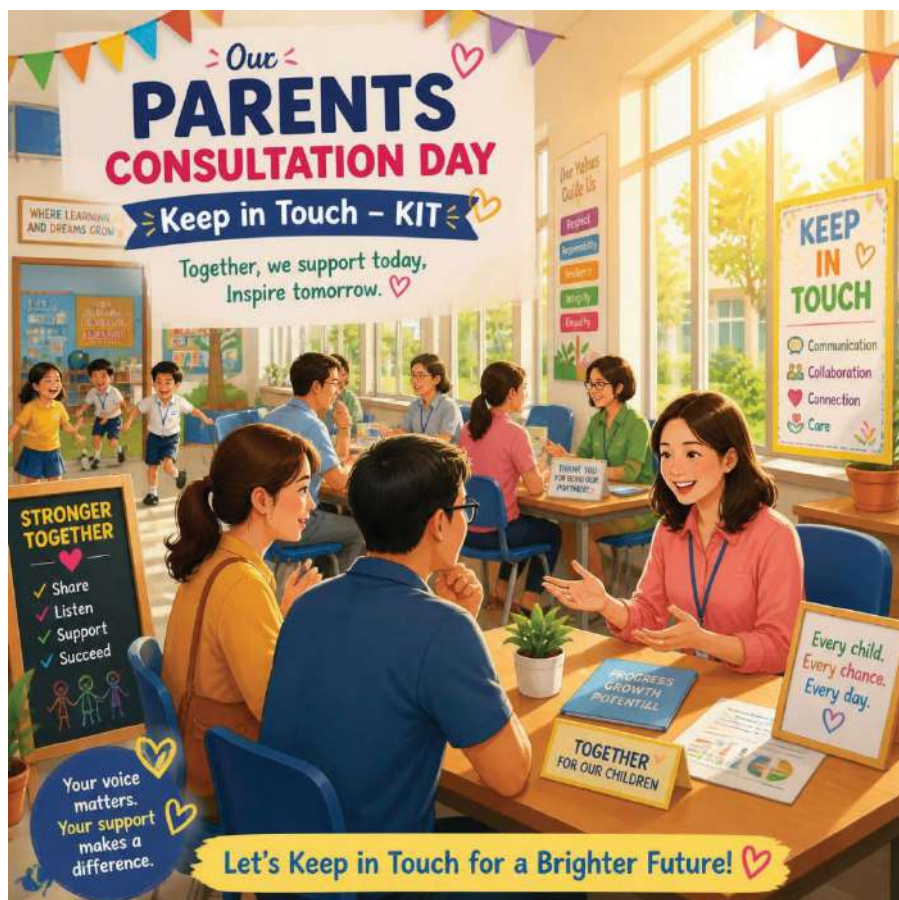

The primary objective of the visit was to expose learners to the practical operation of a recreational facility and to enhance their understanding of the sport and leisure industry. Students were expected to explore the range of recreational activities offered at Panari Ice Rink, observe the management and operational procedures used within the facility as well as realise the importance of health and safety in ensuring a positive customer experience.

Year 4 students explored the exciting topic of electrical circuits. The learners identified the different components of a simple circuit, including a cell (battery), wires, a bulb, and a switch.

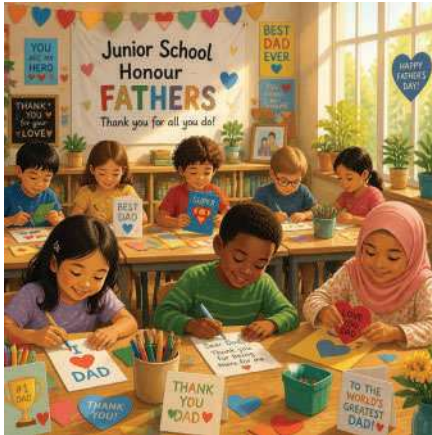
The students worked in groups to build their own simple circuits. This hands-on learning experience encouraged curiosity, teamwork, and problem-solving skills.

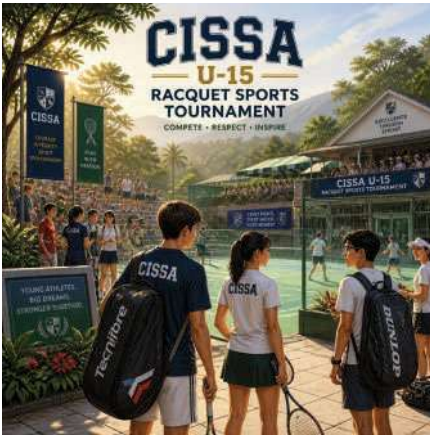
Athletes tackled heat, demanding courses that pushed every runner to their limits. Through

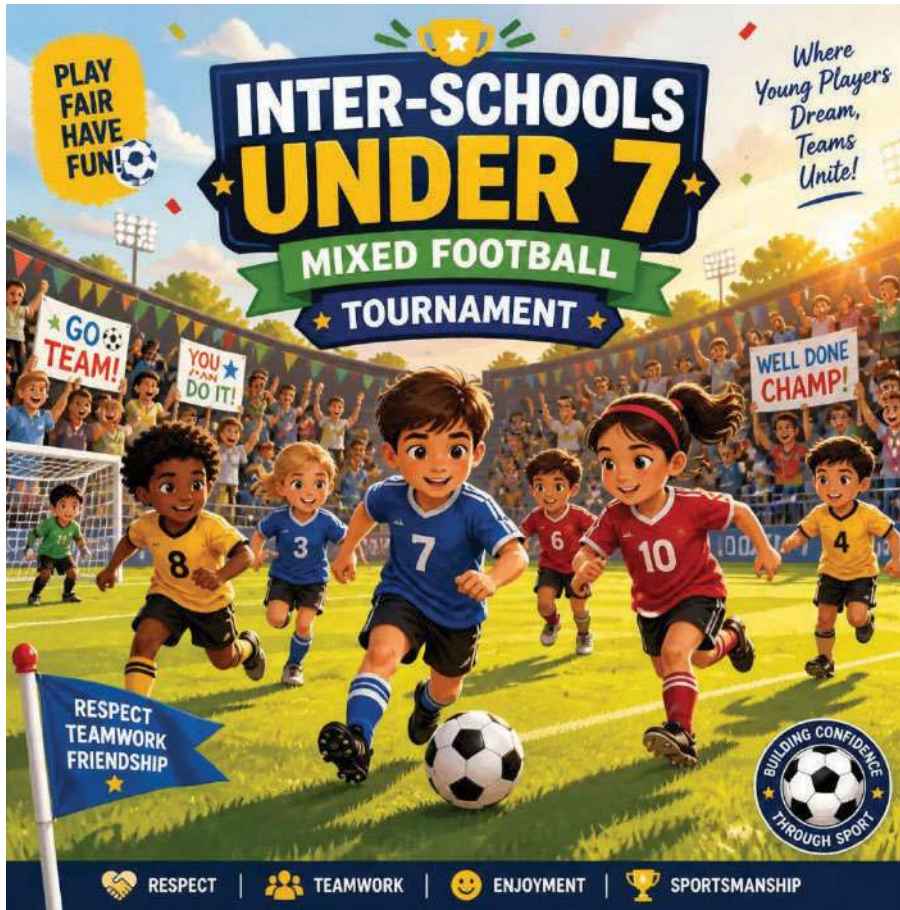

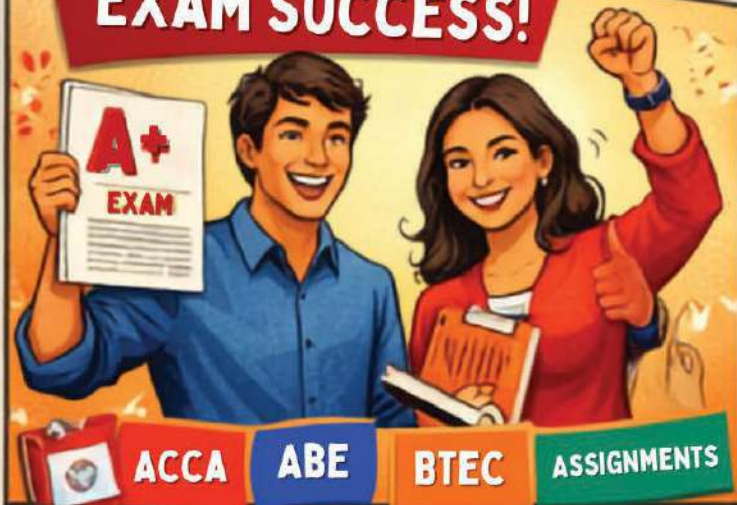
